

ATS Health Equity and Diversity Committee Statement on Juneteenth 2023

The American Thoracic Society's Health Equity and Diversity Committee stands united with the ATS in our commitment to advancing equity in the pulmonary community and broader society. Juneteenth commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans in the U.S., marking the day that the Emancipation Proclamation finally reached Texas in 1865 – two and a half years after it was issued. It serves as a reminder of the ongoing struggle for freedom, justice, and equity for all.

We honor this day by reaffirming our dedication to the pursuit of health equity and inclusivity.

The American Thoracic Society (ATS) has long recognized the critical importance of equity in respiratory health. As a diverse and inclusive professional association, we strive to eliminate disparities in health care access, treatment, and outcomes, toward the attainment of the highest level of respiratory health for all people.
