The AII Nominating Committee (Martha Monick, University of Iowa, Chair, Lauren Cohn, Yale University and Bruce Levy, Harvard University) met by phone on February 1. The committee charge was to nominate people for the upcoming AII leadership position elections at ATS. The committee was pleased to find that there was a large cohort of talented individuals who have chosen to give freely of their time to enhance the work of the Assembly.

Following deliberation, the following were chosen as candidates: Assembly

Chair: Serpil Erzurum, Cleveland Clinic and Clay Marsh, Ohio State University; Program Committee Chair: John Fahy, UCSF and Elliot Israel, Harvard University; Nominating Committee: Julie Wilder, Lovelace Research Inst and Peter Sterk, Leiden University.

The final vote for one Assembly Chair, one Program Committee Chair-Elect and two Nominating Committee members will take place at the Assembly meeting in Toronto. We hope that in support of the excellent candidates and their ongoing work for the Assembly that as many

members as possible attend the meeting and vote. Your participation is important. If you've never attended the yearly Assembly meeting at ATS, think about adding the Assembly meeting to your ATS agenda. Coming to the meeting doesn't commit to any more work than voting for your new leaders, but does provide the opportunity to expand your participation in ATS.

AII Program Committee Report Ray Stokes Peebles, Ir, MD, Chair

For the last few years, the Program Committee of AII has made a concerted effort to pair junior and senior faculty as chairs

of minisymposia, poster discussion, and thematic poster sessions at the International Conference. In order to determine if this was a format that was useful and desired by the facilitators, a survey

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was sent to faculty who facilitated at the 2007 International Conference. Over 90% of the facilitators surveyed responded and the vast majority appreciated the opportunity to interact with AII members with whom they either didn't previously know or with whom they had had little interaction in the past. Many of the responders indicated that discussion among the facilitators prior to the International Conference about the goals for the session and organization of the duties of each facilitator was a key for a successful program. All facilitators responding indicated that they would be willing to serve in this capacity again.

The success of the upcoming International Conference will be in large part due to the efforts made by each member of the AII Programming Committee. Our assembly received more abstracts than any other, and grading such a large number is a daunting task. Given the large number of abstracts, this year's committee was increased to 65 members in order to decrease the number of abstracts that were assigned for review to any one committee member. In years past, some reviewers might be assigned 300 or more abstracts, making this responsibility a very time consuming and somewhat tedious task. Increasing the

number of reviewers ensured that no person would have to review more than 130 abstracts, and most reviewed less than 100. Also, each abstract was assigned to at least 5 reviewers, making the process more democratic. The success of this strategy depended upon each committee member grading all abstracts assigned to her or him. Our committee's response was tremendous in that every reviewer graded each abstract assigned for a 100% overall completion rate. Therefore, we all owe the Program Committee members a hearty thank you for their efforts on behalf of our assembly.
