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MESSAGE FROM THE ASSEMBLY CHAIR Jordi Mancebo, MD

Dear Assembly on Critical Care Members,

Warm greetings! This newsletter contains some information about the Assembly on Critical Care (CC) activities since the last ATS International Conference in May 2006 and about the 2007 International Conference, which will be held in San Francisco, California, from May 18-23, 2007.

ASSEMBLY ON CRITICAL CARE PROJECTS

Assembly projects represent important part of the activities of our Assembly members. Some of the current CC Assembly projects are:

1. "International Consensus Conferences (ICC) in Critical Care" These Conferences began in 1992 and have occurred at one to two year intervals. They were initially sponsored by the Société de Réanimation de Langue Française (SRLF), the European Society of Intensive Care Medicine (ESICM) and the ATS. The European Respiratory Society (ERS) and the Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM) have also recently joined. Each Conference focuses on a critical care clinical issue about

which there is some supporting evidence, but also substantial controversy. The format for the Conferences includes "expert testimony" and extensive discussions on several key questions pertinent to the topic. A consensus report is then prepared by a "jury" and published in sponsoring societies' journals and websites. Earlier topics included: Tissue hypoxia, Ventilatorassociated lung injury, Non-invasive ventilation, ICU-acquired pneumonia, Challenges in end-of-life care, Acute pancreatitis, Weaning from mechanical ventilation, and Hemodynamic monitoring in shock and implications for management. This year, in early May

2007 (Montreal, Quebec, Canada), a new conference on Management and prevention of acute renal failure in an ICU patient has been held. Amal Jubran, M.D., and Constantine Manthous, M.D., are the Assembly on CC representatives to the ICC organizing committee. This year, the ATS has been the organizing society and Amal Jubran, MD and Christian Brun-Buisson, MD have cochaired the conference.

2. "International Trainee Travel Award" This project is organized by the International Lung Health and Membership Committees of the ATS. Its purpose is to to provide trainees from outside the US and (Continued on page 2)

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Canada with an opportunity to present their research at the ATS International Conference; to create opportunities for interactions between international trainees and other scientists in their area of research; and to encourage the trainees to become full members of ATS, with active participation in their assemblies. Our International Affairs Committee, chaired by Claudia dos Santos (Toronto, Canada), is charged with the nomination of the three awardees. This committee will also select the fellows travel awardees for ATS members who submitted a meritorious abstract for the ATS Int'l Conference.

PLEASE CONSIDER SUBMITTING AN ASSEMBLY/COMMITTEE PROJECT APPLICATION FOR FUNDING IN FY2008

For your information, the FY2008 (January 1-December 31, 2008) project application forms for Assembly/Committee projects will be available on the ATS website (www.thoracic.org) on May 1, 2007. There will be a link to the project submission forms on the ATS homepage.

Please consider submitting an application for an Assembly/Committee project. If you have an idea for a project application and you need assistance, please contact your Assembly Planning Committee chair Anthony Suffredini at asuffredini@mail.cc.nih.gov.

The timeline for the application and review process follows:

- May 2007: FY2008 forms are available
- July 23, 2007: Assembly/

Committee project applications are due to the ATS office. Late submissions will not be accepted.

- Early-mid August 2007: abridged versions of the proposals will be posted on the ATS site and emails will be sent to ATS Leadership, Assembly Planning Committee Chairs, Assembly Chairs, ATS Committee Chairs, appropriate ATS staff and the PRS committee, to notify them that the current, un-reviewed proposals are available. This will give everyone an opportunity to touch base with any of the applicants if they would like to get involved with a project before it goes to the PRS for review.
- August 1-17, 2007: Assembly Planning Committees will meet via conference call to review appropriate propos-

als. Any proposal that has indicated on the form that a specific ATS committee may want to become involved will be sent to the ATS committee chair and to the appropriate staff member. Committees are encouraged to work with appropriate ATS staff and review any proposals and to send recommendations to the applicant and to the PRS. P

- September 4, 2007: Revised proposals and all reviews from Assemblies and Committees are due to ATS office. This includes any proposal that has revisions based on a review by an Assembly Planning Committee or an ATS Committee.
- Early October 2007: Program Review Sub-Committee (PRS) meeting.
- Early November 2007: Program & Budget Com-

mittee (P&B) meeting. Recommendations from the PRS will be provided to the P&B Committee. At the discretion of the P&B Committee, specific projects will be added to the FY2007 budget as new items.

• December 2007: ATS Board reviews FY 2008 Budget
