Planning Committee Update Anthony F. Suffredini, MD, Chair

The Planning Committee under the leadership of Anthony Suffredini reviewed 7 proposals submitted by our Assembly for ATS funding. Four of these proposals were directly from Critical Care Assembly and three were submitted in conjunction with other assemblies.

A workshop entitled "Acquired Weakness in Critical Illness: Assessments, Definitions, and Interventions", submitted by Naeem Ali, MD, was endorsed and approved for funding for 2009. The International Consensus Conference on "Therapeutic Hypothermia: To Cool or not to Cool", submitted by Lluis Blanch, was endorsed and approved for funding for 2009. A course on "Optimizing Pulmonary, Sleep, and Critical Care Therapies When Resources Are limited", submitted by Amal Jubran, MD in collaboration with the Clinical Problems and Sleep and Neurobiology Assemblies, was strongly endorsed by the Planning Committee but was not approved for funding by the Program Review Subcommittee. A proposal "Ethics of Cost Containment in Acute Care Medicine", submitted by Michael Rie, MD, was reviewed by the committee and recommendations for further refinement of the proposal were provided.

Website Update

David Kaufman, MD, Web Director

Under the leadership of David Kaufman, our Web Director, the Critical Care Website continues to be a major source of communication and education to the membership. Critiques of original articles dealing with acute respiratory failure, mechanical ventilation, basic and translational science, general critical care, surgical critical care and pediatric critical care are published on a regular basis. In addition, we have introduced Live Chat discussions in which readers can participate in a discussion online with the author of a particular paper. These live chats generated spirited discussions among participants (see http://www.thoracic.org/sections/clinical-information/critical-care/journal-club/nov-2008.html). We strongly encourage members to log on Critical Care Journal Club and participate in our next Live Chat.

The Critical Care Clinical Cases section of the website has been revived under the leadership of Nitin Seam – Associate Director of the Website. Esophageal perforation after sexual intercourse, the development of ARDS after lobectomy, or the interpretation of diagnostic tests when evaluating abdominal pain are some of the cases that are currently posted on the **Critical Care Cases** website (<u>http://www.thoracic.org/sections/clinical-information/critical-care/critical-care-cases/index.html</u>). With the introduction of the ATS Forums, members can send in their comments and critiques about the posted cases.
