It was an active year for our Assembly and ATS. First our Assembly's name "officially" changed from the Environmental and Occupational Health (EOH) Assembly to the Environmental, Occupational and Population Health (EOPH) Assembly to better reflect our Assembly's focus on environmental and occupational factors that impact the health of populations (as well as individuals). After approval by EOH Assembly members last year,

the name change was approved by the other ATS Assembly Chairs (September 2013) and then by the ATS Board of Directors (February 2014).

An ad hoc ATS Committee was formed to review and comment on the proposed **OSHA rule on Occupational Exposure to Respirable Crystalline Silica** on behalf of the ATS. **Drs. Robert Cohen (Chair), Cecile Rose, Tee Guidotti, David Christiani, and William Beckett** worked tirelessly to review the rule (> 750 pages long) and draft comments in strong support of lowering the OSHA standard for silica. Several other organizations including ACOEM, ACCP and AOEC signed on in support of the ATS comments, which Dr. Cohen recently presented at a Public Hearing in Washington (March 2014). Thank you to everyone on the ATS Silica Committee!

Dr. Patricia Finn, President of the ATS, has made promoting health equality an ATS priority. The EOPH Assembly has highlighted the importance of equality in environmental and occupational lung health, which can be accomplished through 1) better surveillance of exposed communities, 2) better indoor and outdoor air quality, and 3) reduced hazardous work conditions.

In addition to our EOPH Assembly committees and activities, EOPH members serve on a number of the ATS-wide committees, including Environmental Health Policy, International Health, Documents & Development, and Health Policy. (Committees and members are listed on the ATS website). EOPH Assembly members (junior and senior members) are strongly encouraged to get involved in EOPH Assembly and ATS activities. You can contact the Chair of any EOPH Assembly or ATS Committee directly, or me. You can participate even if you are unable to attend the upcoming ATS Annual Meeting.
