Twelve members from North America, Europe and Australia regularly participated in RSF Planning Committee activities for year 2004-2005. The major activities of the group included the evaluation of projects submitted by members affiliated to RSF or other assemblies, the organization of assembly dinner and awards.

Among the projects evaluated for year 2005-06, the Committee strongly supported project proposals by Dr. Robert Brown entitled "Advances in Small Animal Imaging: Application to Lung Pathophysiology" and by Dr. Charlie Irvin entitled, "Lecture Notes of Pulmonary Physiology." The ATS Program Review Sub-Committee approved both projects, which will be supported by the Society. An ongoing project headed up by Dr. Chun Y. Seow, "Airway Smooth Muscle Adaptation to Length Change: Implications for Airway Hyperresponsiveness" was very active throughout the past year. Please see Dr. Seow's comments elsewhere in this newsletter.

The tradition of an RSF-sponsored dinner will continue this year with featured speaker Dr. Peter Wagner, current president of the ATS, providing the after dinner talk. The 2006 RSF Assembly Dinner is generously supported by an unrestricted grant from Merck. As in previous years, two prestigious awards, the Joseph R. Rodarte Award for Scientific Distinction and the ATS Ann Woolcock Memorial Award will be presented at the dinner to the awardees identified by the RSF Planning Committee. The Joseph R. Rodarte Award has been made available through a generous grant from the SensorMedics, a subsidiary of Viasys Healthcare, and is annually awarded to an established investigator with recognized and distinguished scientific achievement in the area of respiratory structure. The Ann Woolcock Award, which is supported by an endowment that has been established through the generosity of GlaxoSmithKline and the Thoracic Society of Australia and New Zealand, is annually awarded to a young investigator for career research accomplishments in the field of asthma. Finally, the Assembly will present travel awards to eight individuals selected for the scientific excellence of their submitted abstract. The RSF Travel Awards are made possible by a grant from ndd Medical Technologies.

The RSF Program Committee is pleased to announce an outstanding Research Forum for the upcoming ATS International Conference in San Diego. Overall, the abstract submissions for the symposia from all assemblies have diminished in comparison to 2005. Specifically, RSF in 2005 received 586 abstracts; however, in 2006, we received 536 abstracts. Although there is a slight decrease in the number of abstracts, we procured 7 mini-symposia, presenting 59 abstracts and 8 poster discussion sessions, presenting 193 abstracts. In addition, RSF obtained two additional symposia slots in comparison with the previous year for a total of 7 full symposia. Overall, the RSF Assembly has done remarkably well and continues to be at the forefront of presentations at the International Conference. Over the past 12 months, it has been a great pleasure and privilege to serve as chair of the Program Committee, and we are looking forward to continued success as Dr. Andrew Halayko assumes the chairmanship of the RSF Program Committee at the 2006 International Conference.

Project Update: "Airway Smooth Muscle Adaptation to Length Change: Implications for Airway Hyperresponsiveness"

Chun Y. Seow, PhD, University of British Columbia

This ongoing project involves a workshop, which was held during the 2005 ATS conference in San Diego, and a state-of-the-art review on the topics discussed during the workshop, which is to be written collectively by assembly members. During the workshop, we reviewed and updated our knowledge in the areas of airway smooth muscle contractile mechanisms, mechanisms of airway narrowing, effects of dynamic lung environment on airway smooth muscle contractility, and airway resistance in vitro and in vivo. All these were discussed extensively during the daylong workshop under a unifying theme of airway hyperresponsiveness. A preliminary draft of the review has been produced and is currently under revision. The draft will be circulated to all committee members involved in the workshop sometime in March 2006. A meal meeting for members who are involved in the writing of the first draft is planned during the upcoming ATS Conference in San Diego in May to discuss remaining issues regarding the manuscript and to finalize the review before submission for publication.

The timeline for the application and review process follows:

April 2006: FY2007 forms are available.

July 25, 2006: Assembly/Committee project applications are due to the ATS office. Late submissions will not be accepted.

Early-mid August 2006: abridged versions of the proposals will be posted on the ATS site and emails will be sent to ATS Leadership, Assembly Planning Committee Chairs, Assembly Chairs, ATS Committee Chairs, appropriate ATS staff and the PRS committee, to notify them that the current, un-reviewed proposals are available. This will give everyone an opportunity to touch base with any of the applicants if they would like to get involved with a project before it goes to the PRS for review.

August 1-18, 2006: Assembly Planning Committees will meet via conference call to review appropriate proposals. Any proposal that has indicated on the form that a specific ATS committee may want to become involved will be sent to the ATS committee chair and to the appropriate staff member. Committees are encouraged to work with appropriate ATS staff and review any proposals and to send recommendations to the applicant and to the PRS.

September 6, 2006: Revised proposals and all reviews from Assemblies and Committees are due to ATS office. This includes any proposal that has revisions based on a review by an Assembly Planning Committee or an ATS Committee.

Early October 2006: Program Review Sub-Committee (PRS) meeting.

Early November 2006: Program & Budget Committee (P&B) meeting. Recommendations from the PRS will be provided to the P&B Committee. At the discretion of the P&B Committee, specific projects will be added to the FY2007 budget as new items.

December 2006: ATS Board reviews FY 2007 Budget.
